- Provide services within UWDATS service area;
- Program alignment with our focus of poverty prevention and/or reduction in the areas of heath, education, and financial stability and;
- Ability to report regularly on local community outcomes.

- Maximum ask can be no more than 20% of organization's annual operating budget.
