- Caregiver Resources Center is OPEN! Joleen Koopman is the new coordinator. Able to meet with people. Information on the Stonehill website. Caregivers of any age caring for anyone of any age can receive support.
- Working to get the reminder of their staff vaccinated as they fall under the mandate. 76% of staff and nearly 100% of residents are already vaccinated.
- CMS has direct that they are open for visitors. Still screen all visitors and ask people not to come if they are sick.
- Worker shortages continue- across the healthcare field.

- Still taking referrals for one time assistance. Still filing opens for people literally homeless.
- Street outreach if you see anyone who may need assistance, send Ashely or I an e mail. Try to get out every 2 weeks to touch base with people.
- Point in time count in January. Volunteers will go out in the middle of the night to try to find people at their campsites. Will provide physical resources (blankets, supplies, etc.) as well as connect them to services.
- Still partnering with DALH for food delivery. new phone line 563-690-5735. Deliveries are 1<sup>st</sup> & 3rd Saturday of every month.
